Administration

Office assistant

Location: Green Lane

A drop-in centre for over-50s needs volunteers for tasks including assisting with reception, preparing refreshments in the kitchen, and running groups and classes for attendees, for a minimum of four hours a week. Training is given.

A community hub is looking for volunteers to help with day-to-day administration. Digital champion

Location: Nags Head Road

Volunteers with a basic knowledge of IT are needed to support and encourage people to access the digital world. You will make a difference by coaching people in how to use the internet and email, build up their digital confidence and troubleshoot basic issues. You will need to be patient, empathetic and non-judgemental to our members. You must be willing to commit to at least one day, (or two mornings, or two afternoons) once a week for at least six months. A DBS check is essential for this role. Training will

Volunteers will act as the first point of contact in the reception area, be responsible for meeting and greeting visitors to a drop-in centre. You will carry out light triage to assess people's needs and collect basic demographic information before directing individuals to a staff member for appointments. Volunteers must have experience of working in an office or reception, good communication skills and the ability to work in a team. You should preferably be available during weekdays either from 8am to 10am or from 2pm to 4pm. Training is given. A DBS check is essential and travel expenses are provided.

Befriending and mentoring

Independent visitor

Location: Enfield

Independent visitors are needed by a national charity to work with children and young people aged between five and 18 who are in care. You will work with an individual young person for a minimum of two years. In this time, you will help them explore their interests, support them to make their own decisions and be a positive influence during the time you spend with them. Volunteers will help the young people through both good and tough times, helping them to explore their interests and the world around them, guiding and nurturing where that's needed, having lots of fun and helping them understand themselves better. You must be willing to travel and available once a month for four hours, for a minimum of a year. Full induction and training is provided and travel expenses are paid. A DBS check is essential.

A faith charity providing support to people working in the sex industry or affected by sexual exploitation is recruiting to its outreach team. You will offer emotional support, build connections, and engage in warm,

meaningful conversations with those you meet. You must be a team player with a caring spirit, commitment to confidentiality, and have a basic understanding of safeguarding. You should be available every Friday evening for two hours. A DBS check is essential.

Female volunteers are needed join a dedicated team supporting women who are involved in street sex work. You must have good interpersonal and communication skills and a non-judgemental attitude. Active listening skills and a calm, empathetic presence are vital for this position. You must be available every Thursday evening for two hours, starting at 9.30pm and willing to make a commitment of at least six months. Tasks will include offering women hot drinks, care packs, and a friendly listening ear in a safe and non-judgemental space. There are opportunities to get involved with daytime drop-in sessions and support projects. A DBS check is essential. Training and support are given.

The role includes coaching, attending meetings and assisting with complex tasks like setting up a business bank account. You will help make a positive impact on children's lives. You must be enthusiastic, willing to learn new skills, reliable and have a friendly manner. You will work alongside staff and have the opportunity to get involved in either a community stay and play scheme (age 0-five), an after-school club (age four-11) or a youth club – this is an ideal opportunity for a newly qualified youth worker or children's worker to develop programmes and activities with other youth workers, once a week. DBS check is essential. Flexible times are available. Training and support will be provided.

Meet and greet

Location: Silver Street

A local church drop-in on Tuesday and Wednesday, which provides a range of activities from coffee mornings to "stitch and chat" is looking for friendly and enthusiastic volunteers to support the coordinator at one of our friendly centres. You will also provide occasional help with foodbank stock, serving refreshments, assisting activity leaders to run sessions or just having a chat. Volunteers should be available on Tuesdays or Wednesdays any time between 10am and 5pm. A DBS check is essential.

Shifts are available from 8.45am to 12.45pm and from 12.30pm to 4.30pm, Monday to Friday and Saturday morning. Training is given.

Assisting at a day centre

Location: Pymmes Park

A busy day centre for people facing homelessness is looking for volunteers on Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Thursdays, any time from 8am to 2pm, with different shifts available. You will help set up rooms, and prepare and serve hot lunches to rough sleepers. You will also manage the showers and provide users with a towel and fresh underwear, do general tidying up and serve refreshments to service users. You will be given training and support to ensure you feel comfortable in this role.

Volunteers are required to help the team organise, sort and prepare food parcels, and assist recipients as they shop at our food bank. This is a physically active role that includes lifting. You must be willing to commit once every two weeks preferably Tuesday or Thursday, either morning or afternoon, with an ideal target of 10-12 shifts over six months. Full training is given.

Home visiting volunteer

Location: Enfield

A local association is looking for volunteers who can offer practical and emotional support to visually impaired people in

their own homes for two hours per week. This will involve befriending an individual person, going on outings to the shops, cafes or walks in the park, and reading correspondence. You must be willing to commit to at least one hour a week or two hours every other week for 12 months. A DBS check is essential. Training is given and travel expenses are paid.

Part-time driver

Location: Southgate

Volunteer drivers with valid driving licenses are needed to transport people living in the Enfield area, who have difficulty getting out and about, to and from a once a month Friday evening club for refreshments, entertainment and friendship.

You will accompany volunteer drivers in a van on a delivery and collection route. This role involves helping to load and unload the van, navigating and dealing with the administration involved. Shifts are from 8.45am to 12.45pm and 12.30pm to 4.30pm on weekdays and Saturday mornings, and you can choose your shift.

Location: Ponders End Road

Part-time drivers aged between 25 and 64 with a category D1 licence are needed to drive a 16-seater manually operated minibus that is adapted for wheelchair users for a local drop-in centre. You will assist the centre by transporting elderly and disabled people, helping them to and from their homes as needed. You should be available between Mondays and Fridays, with flexible start and finish times based on the transport needs of clients. A DBS check is essential, travel expenses are paid and training is given.

EnLab heritage volunteer

Location: various schools in Enfield

Volunteers aged over 18, who are enthusiastic and reliable, with a keen interest in heritage, local history, community and green spaces, are needed to join our vibrant team and help inspire young people. You will support the manager with variety of roles and activities, including helping with school workshops and developing engaging resources, supporting heritage and community events, and organising family activities, creative crafts and activities in parks. No experience is necessary as training will be provided. You must be available during school term time. Flexible hours are available. A DBS check

Using a six-step process, you will help the school's sustainability lead identify key leverage points, build whole-school engagement, and plan practical sustainability actions. A DBS check is essential and training is given.

Educational mentors

Location: various libraries

A national charity providing educational support to young refugees is seeking volunteers to work with unaccompanied minors, and other refugees and asylum seekers aged 14-25. You'll be matched with a young person and meet weekly to support their learning and boost their confidence. You must have experience working with young people and be available during weekdays for a minimum of two hours a week, for a minimum of six months. Sessions take place either in a public library or in a cafe local to the young person. A DBS check is essential. Training and support are given and travel expenses are paid.

Numeracy supporter

Location: Lovell Road and Palmers Green

Volunteers are required to visit primary schools and provide one-to-one support to year 2 or year 3 children to help with maths skills and confidence. Volunteers should be confident in maths, available for two hours a week in school term time and also able to attend training for half a day before the sessions start. A DBS check is essential. Travel expenses are provided.

Maths and English tutor

Location: Enfield

Exceptional role models are needed to join this leadership programme. You will volunteer as an English or maths tutor to a small group of the pupils who are currently underperforming and provide them with the academic support,

encouragement and inspiration they need to get back on track. You will deliver sessions after school from 3pm to 5pm during term time. Training is given and travel expenses are provided. A DBS check is essential.

Listen to children read books

Location: various schools in Enfield

If you have a good grasp of written English and enjoy spending time with children, you could help children with their reading. Volunteers aged over 18 are required to visit primary schools and read with selected children whose literacy and self-confidence could benefit from one-to-one support. Volunteers must be willing to commit once a week for one hour or more for a minimum of 12 months. Sessions will take place at times that are mutually convenient, mostly during the school day in term time. Training for this role is provided. A DBS check is essential.

Be a reading hero

Location: various schools in Enfield

As a reading hero volunteer, you'll play a vital role in helping children build confidence and improve their reading skills by reading with individuals or small groups in one of our partner primary schools. This programme focuses on fostering a love of reading, boosting self-esteem, and unlocking new opportunities for children who may not have access to books or reading role models at home. With a weekly or fortnightly commitment of just two hours a week for at least a term, you'll make a meaningful impact while sharing the joy of reading. If you're passionate, patient, and eager to support young learners, this is the perfect opportunity for you.

Location: various schools in Enfield

As a governor you will learn how a school is run, develop leadership skills and contribute to the wellbeing and development of young people in your community. For this challenging and rewarding role, you need to be over 18 and have an interest in education – you do not need to be a parent. School governors work with school staff, the local authority and / or other relevant bodies

to run schools. Governors are responsible for managing the budget, overseeing the curriculum and appointing staff. People are elected or appointed as a governor. School governors serve for an average term of four years.

Location: working from home

You will act as a positive adult role model for the pupils you support. Whatever your background or experiences, you can inspire ambition in them. Volunteers must be educated to degree level and you must have an A level in the subject you are seeking to tutor, whether that is English or maths. A DBS check is essential. Full training is given.

Environment

Help with garden maintenance

Location: Edmonton Green Library

Volunteers are needed at least once a week to maintain a small community garden's crops and overall presentation. Tasks include weeding, watering, composting, sowing seeds and planting in raised beds. Please wear sturdy shoes and bring your own gloves.

Growing food in a community garden

Location: Meridian Water

Volunteers will help to maintain the garden through activities such as weeding, watering, composting, sowing seeds and planting in raised beds. Libraries

Assist the autism play group

Location: Edmonton Green Library

An engaging volunteer is needed to help facilitate an arts, crafts and play session with autistic and neurodivergent primary school-aged children. Tasks include helping to set up the equipment and toys before the session, assisting with arts and craft activities and playing with the children. Volunteers must have experience with neurodivergent children, a positive attitude and a friendly approach. You should be available on Saturday mornings twice a month. Training and travel expenses are provided.

Volunteers with knowledge and experience of 3D printing and modelling on a Flash Forge Creator 3 printer are needed to run activities and teach participants to create 3D models and print them using library equipment. Older people

Community activity assistant

Location: Village Road

A day care centre for older people, especially those who are affected by dementia, runs daily activities including arts, crafts, quizzes, exercise and reminiscence. Volunteers are needed to meet and greet participants when they

arrive and support the team with making drinks, chatting and socialising. You will also be encouraged to participate in crafts, singing, dancing and similar activities. Flexible times are available, but you should preferably be willing to commit to two to four hours per week, between 9am and 5pm on a weekday. An enhanced DBS check is required.

Footcare assistant

Location: Lancaster Road

A drop-in centre offering basic footcare, such as toenail cutting and hard skin removal, for elderly and disabled clients is recruiting a footcare assistant, preferably available on Tuesdays or Wednesdays. Full training will be given by one of our podiatrists and you will work alongside a friendly team of dedicated and experienced volunteers. Become a sea cadet instructor

Alpha Care Specialists, formerly the Greek and Greek Cypriot Community of Enfield, is an established charity that provides psychotherapy services, offers information, advice and signposting for those leaving hospital, and operates a respected domiciliary care agency supporting residents across the community. It is seeking volunteers with experience in charity governance, IT, public relations, marketing, legal matters or fundraising to join the board of trustees and help broaden the organisation's collective expertise.
